

SUGGESTED QUALIFICATIONS: Either:

- (A) Possession of a Master's Degree in civil or environmental engineering from a regionally accredited or New York State registered school of engineering **AND** six (6) years of experience involving civil or environmental engineering; **OR**
- (B) Possession of Bachelor's Degree in civil or environmental engineering **AND** seven (7) years of experience involving civil or environmental engineering; **OR**
- (C) Possession of Bachelor's Degree in engineering **AND** nine (9) years of experience involving civil, environmental, or mechanical engineering.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: Possession of a current valid Professional Engineer's License issued by the New York State Education Department at time of appointment.

NOTES:

- Candidates MUST submit with application a copy of transcripts showing degree area and date degree conferred.
- Degree(s) must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If the degree was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, the candidate must provide independent verification of equivalency.
